




2023 ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE

Guimaras ranked 8th as the fastest-growing province in the Philippines in 2023. This performance is driven by a 7.9% increase in GDP, raising the province's total GDP from Php 16.14 Billion in 2022 to Php 17.42 Billion in 2023. This translates to a Php 1.28 Billion into the

local economy.







Guimaras, strategically nestled between Panay and Negros, possesses the natural attributes and location to become a leading transshipment hub and seaport province in the Visayas. Its calm, protected waters provide a natural harbor, offering a safe haven for ships navigating the region's busy sea lanes.

TRAVEL GOING TO GUIMARAS

From Iloilo International Airport

- Take a point bus or van to Iloilo City Proper (1 hour)
- From Iloilo City proper, take a PUJ or taxi going to Parola Wharf (30 minutes)
- Ride a ferry boat going to Guimaras (15-20 minutes)
- Take a PUJ or DOT accredited tourist transport operators going to your desired destinations in Guimaras

GOOD ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE

Guimaras completed 100% paving of its circumferential roads, improved farm to market roads, upgraded cross-island links, and upgraded cross island links and developed a 71 km loop agri-ecotourism circuit.



The newly paved and widened roads ensure smoother, safer and faster transportation of goods and people. The 71-km agri-eco tourism circuit provides a seamless and enjoyable experience for visitors, connecting key attractions and agricultural sites. 

SUPPORTIVE POLICIES

The Guimaras Investment Code of 2017

To stimulate economic growth and attract both domestic and foreign investment, the Province of Guimaras enacted Provincial Ordinance No. 2017-013, known as the Guimaras Investment Code of 2017. The updating of the Investment Code is still ongoing to streamline business processes and ensure investor-friendly environment.

This Code outlines the province's commitment to providing fiscal and non-fiscal incentives to encourage investment in key sectors.

Fiscal Incentives

A registered enterprise qualified under the Code shall within three (3) years from the start of its commercial operation.

Non-Fiscal Incentives



Provision of a one-stop documentation center for simplified documentation procedures:



Assistance in securing direct source of electric power and water supply connection.



Assistance in site selection, negotiation for right of way and construction of access road.



Assistance in labor recruitment and arbitration.



Assistance in coordinating with the Bureau of Immigration and Bureau of Customs;



Other non-fiscal incentives as may be determined by the Board.

The Integrated Coastal Management Program

The Province of Guimaras has enacted Ordinance No. 2018-06, Series of 2018 otherwise known as Integrated Coastal Management (ICM) Ordinance. It provides a framework for sustainable development and responsible investment. Key areas of competence to addressed sustainable development aspects include: (1) hazard prevention and management; (2) habitat protection, restoration and management (3) water use and supply management; (4) food security and livelihood management and (5) pollution reduction and waste management.




